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About of MANTRA project

The MANTRA project aims to speed up the green and digital transformation of European manufacturing SMEs by promoting the adoption of advanced technologies and social innovation. MANTRA will create a scalable Europe-wide capacity-building and demonstration program to provide SMEs with essential support, expert networks, and financial resources to develop and implement tailored transformation strategies that lead to more sustainable business models, enhanced competitiveness, and greater resilience.

The MANTRA project also emphasizes the importance of tech-savvy SMEs in driving green and digital transformation. These tech-savvy SMEs, identified through Expressions of Interest calls, will collaborate with traditional manufacturing SMEs to foster strategic alliances and share their expertise in advanced technologies.

1.Call for Expression of Interest for Tech-savvy SMEs

MANTRA is organizing a specific call for Expression of Interest with the aim of identifying and selecting tech savvy SMEs interested in supporting traditional SMEs in their digital, green and social transformation. The selected organizations will be validated and incorporated into the MANTRA Pool of tech- savvy SMEs, which will serve as a key resource to foster strategic alliances between tech-savvy actors and Traditional SMEs.

The current Call for Expressions of Interest is **open from 15.03.2026** with closure envisaged for **31.08.2027**.

To support the uptake of advanced technologies across traditional sectors, MANTRA is developing a **technical marketplace**. This platform will allow traditional SMEs to discover and connect with a curated portfolio of tech-savvy SMEs that are developing, producing, and commercializing **advanced technology solutions** for the manufacturing industry. These technologies will be aligned with one or more of the **16 Advanced Technologies for Industry (ATIs)** and categorized based on the **environmental challenges** they address.

The marketplace aims to:

- Promote **technology transfer and collaboration** between tech-savvy and traditional SMEs.
- Serve as a **dissemination and visibility platform** for tech-savvy SMEs.
- Maximize the impact on **European industrial competitiveness**.
- Help tech-savvy SMEs expand their **market reach** and foster **strategic alliances**.

To populate the marketplace, **two open calls for Expressions of Interest** will be launched. EoIs will be assessed by MANTRA project partners, based on criteria such as:

- **Technical maturity and coherence**
- **Alignment with sustainable practices**
- **Relevance to the targeted manufacturing sectors**

Selected tech-savvy SMEs will have their solutions featured on the MANTRA marketplace and gain access to the **partner search service** as part of the project's **capacity building programme**.

In addition, selected tech-savvy SMEs will be invited to participate in a **co-creation process**. This will involve **collaborative workshops** with traditional SME beneficiaries, technology providers, and MANTRA experts. Together, they will identify key technical and non-technical gaps related to technology adoption and integration into business strategy.

This initiative focuses on traditional SMEs in sectors such as **machinery, food, textiles, plastics, ceramics, and metals**, aiming to facilitate targeted, high-impact interventions that drive the **green, digital, and social transformation** of European industry.

Why apply?

Advanced technologies not accessible to SMEs. The offer of digital solutions from large tech vendors is fragmented and not always suited to the specific needs of SMEs. Smaller tech vendors face significant challenges preventing them from being as effective as possible in providing innovation solutions to SMEs. MANTRA programme will offer a tech marketplace, matchmaking and co-creation processes helping SMEs to find the service providers that are better suited to their need

2. Who can apply as MANTRA tech savvy?

The MANTRA project is looking for innovative European SMEs with expertise in advanced technology solutions to join its tech-savvy SME Pool, a qualified directory of providers that will support traditional manufacturing companies in their digital, green, and social transformation journeys.

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible, applicants must meet the following conditions:

1. **Legal Entity:** The applicant must be a legally established entity—natural or legal—recognized under national, EU, or international law and able to act in its own name, exercising rights and obligations.
2. **SME Status:** The applicant must be a **Small or Medium-sized Enterprise (SME)** as defined in the **Commission Recommendation 2003/361/EC**, i.e., employing fewer than 250 persons and having an annual turnover not exceeding €50 million and/or an annual balance sheet total not exceeding €43 million.
3. **Geographic eligibility:** The applicant must be established in one of the 27 EU Member States.
4. **Field Experience:** The applying SME must demonstrate at least **2 to 4 years of experience** in the development, production, or commercialization of **advanced technologies** that address digitalization, sustainability, or environmental challenges in the manufacturing sector.
5. **Language requirement:** mandatory English (written and spoken) and knowledge of other languages welcome.

By meeting these application conditions, European SMEs can play a **pivotal role** in the MANTRA project, driving the **green and digital transformation** of the manufacturing sector. Their expertise in advanced technologies and commitment to sustainability will not only **enhance** their own **competitiveness** but also contribute to the **broader goals** of **environmental stewardship** and **industrial resilience**. This collaborative effort **promises** to create a **dynamic ecosystem** where innovation thrives, fostering **sustainable business models** and robust **industrial competences** across Europe.

3. How to apply?

Technology providers interested in supporting traditional manufacturing SMEs in their digital, green, and social transformation are invited to submit their Expression of Interest (Eoi) through the official MANTRA platform. Applications must be submitted online via the dedicated form available on the platform, fully completed in English and within the specified deadline.

The application must be completed in all the sections with the following information:

Section 1. Organisation identity

Basic details about the applying organisation, including its official name, type of entity, location, contact information, and a short overview or introduction to its activities.

Section 2. Organisation expertise

2.1. Advanced technologies solutions

Technology applicants are required to demonstrate strong expertise and relevant professional experience in at least one of the listed technology needs. In this section, the applicant should select the technology need they specialize in and provide a brief summary of their knowledge, skills, and capabilities in that field.

2.2. Knowledge and expertise related to Machinery, Food, Textile, Plastics, Ceramics and Metals

As the MANTRA Tech-savvy SMEs will support Machinery, Food, Textile, Plastics, Ceramics and Metals SMEs in implementing their digital and green transformation. The candidates should provide a short description of their expertise and knowledge regarding the six manufacturing sectors.

Section 3. Organisation Team

In this section, technology provider applicants should provide a description of the internal team members who will be involved in delivering support to manufacturing SMEs.

Clear and detailed commercial agreements will be established between tech-savvy companies and manufacturing SMEs. These agreements will define the terms and conditions of the collaboration, ensuring that both parties understand their rights and responsibilities, and facilitating a harmonious and productive working relationship.

For tech-savvy companies, project partners will have the opportunity to request additional information and assess their suitability to participate in the initiative.

It will be the criteria of these partners that determine whether tech-savvy companies can enter the pool, ensuring that only the most suitable and prepared companies are part of the project.

4. Confidentiality and data protection

As part of the evaluation and selection process, MANTRA will gather personal and business-related data from applicants.

The MANTRA Facilitating Platform is responsible for handling this data in strict adherence to the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (GDPR) and Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 December 2000 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data. The MANTRA platform's security protocols and operational procedures are designed to safeguard the confidentiality and integrity of the collected information. To proceed with their application, all applicants must agree to the terms and conditions of the MANTRA platform.

Additionally, MANTRA will only request the essential information required for the assessment and implementation of the funding program, ensuring that data collection remains limited to what is strictly necessary. 5. Absence of conflict

Applicants must ensure that they do not hold any existing or potential conflicts of interest related to their participation in the MANTRA tech-savvy Pool or throughout the entire duration of the project. Any identified situations of conflict will be reviewed and evaluated individually.

In particular, entities involved in the MANTRA consortium, including their affiliated organizations and staff members, are not eligible to act as tech-savvy within this call.
